

Arrest'R

What Arrest'R does (Roofs, Concreate driveways, Pavers, Stone Surfaces)

- Keeps staining away for 2 years plus (Mold, Mildew, Algae)
- Has true "Residual" Effectiveness
- It's a penetrant (does not evaporate on application)
- Eliminates Chlorine
- Eliminates high pressure cleaning
- Protects Clay or Concreate Roof Tiles
- Protects Asphalt roofs
- Protects Fiberglass
- Protects Wood-composite or wood

What surfaces Arrest'R should not be applied to:

- White Roofs (Arrest'R can stain white roofs)
- Slurry roofs of any kind or color
- PVC fencing

Equipment:

Pumps/ compressor to use

- 8-gal gas air compressor (such as Hitachi) with ¼ in air that connects to diaphragm pump
- 1" Ingersoll Rand Diaphragm pump

Hoses & Fittings (that works best with Arrest'R)

- 1" hose from pump to Titan 200 ft hose reel (stainless steel)
- All hose connectors have to be polypropylene and pvc ball valves where possible

Nozzles (that works best with Arrest'R)

- Stainless quick release with array of 0° tips (0020 0050) and soap dispensing tips (black fan tip for pressure washer)
- All connectors have to be polypropylene and PVC ball valves where possible

Tank Preparation:

- If reusing chlorine tanks for Arrest'R application, triple rinse the tank to insure that there isn't any chlorine contamination.
- Use a new 100-gallon spray/ holding tank for Arrest'R if possible
- Only use suggested Arrest'R label rates for any application
- <u>Always use separate</u> tanks for Chlorine and Arrest'R

Accidental Staining:

- Avoid getting Arrest'R on the side of the house
- Avoid slurry roofs (white roofs, and any slurry roofs of any color)

When staining occurs on application surfaces or the siding of a building, use a 2-gallon chemical sprayer with 1-gallon household bleach and 1 gallon of water and spray the surface to get rid of the staining.

- Staining normally occurs when the roofs/surfaces are not rinsed properly or well maintained.

FAQ'S

- 1. Is Arrest'R a sealant? NO
- 2. Does Arrest'R "Waterproof" ? NO
- 3. Is Arrest'R a coating ? NO
- 4. Does Arrest'R make roofs slippery? **NO MORE THEN WATER DOES**
- 5. Will Arrest'R kill my grass ? *If it puddles in yard, it can damage your grass*
- 6. Will staining reappear 2 years after application? *NO, staining can reappear between 2 ½ to 3 years after application, which is why we recommend treatments every 2 years.*
- 7. Will Arrest'R damage roof tile ? NO, it's less reactive to roof materials than chlorine
- 8. Will Arrest'R damage soffits or gutters? *NO, it's less reactive to metals such as aluminum than chlorine*
- 9. Do I need to use chlorine before each application of Arrest'R ? *NO, it's only used before the very first application of Arrest'R. Arrest'R eliminates future chlorine use.*
- 10. Why do I have to rinse the surface between chlorine application and Arrest'R application? *If the surfaces are not rinsed properly a chemical reaction will occur and neutralize the Arrest'R.*
